## Report: Planned Parenthood's Relationship with Christian Colleges & Universities in the United States

## Introduction

Planned Parenthood is the nation's largest abortion vendor. According to the organization's own <u>annual report</u>, Planned Parenthood killed 354,871 pre-born children in abortion violence last year. Planned Parenthood targets the most vulnerable pregnant women, including college students, for abortion sales. It's no surprise, then, that Planned Parenthood has snaked its way onto college and university campuses all over the United States. But what may come as a surprise to some is that this includes schools that identify as Christian institutions, despite the fact that <u>scripture</u> and Christian tradition are soundly anti-abortion.

Students for Life of America's (SFLA) *Institute for Pro-Life Advancement* investigated all 784 colleges and universities affiliated with Christian churches in the United States, including Catholic and Protestant schools, and found that 103, or **one in eight Christian schools**, maintained some type of relationship with Planned Parenthood.

And these Planned Parenthood—Christian School relationships are demonstrably dangerous and at odds with Biblical values. As SFLA president Kristan Hawkins previously explained in <u>The</u> <u>American Thinker</u>:

- Planned Parenthood has a documented history <u>of *not reporting*</u> the sexual abuse and assault of young women and girls.
- Planned Parenthood is not offering the resources that large numbers of pregnant and parenting students actually *need*. One in five college students is pregnant or parenting, yet <u>new polling</u> <u>commissioned by SFLA</u> found that only 45% of Millennials and Gen Z respondents have seen resources of any kind available to pregnant and parenting students on their campuses.
- Planned Parenthood [furthers] <u>racism</u> and eugenic goals. While Planned Parenthood has recently scrambled to <u>minimize its racist past</u>, the reality is that the group <u>aggressively</u> <u>targets</u> communities of color to <u>sell abortion</u>, which <u>disproportionately kills</u> Black children.



The goal of SFLA's *Christian Schools Project* is to raise public awareness of Christian schools maintaining relationships with Planned Parenthood in order to encourage infracting schools to restore their Christian values by cutting ties with the abortion giant. At the time of publication, the **number of Christian schools maintaining relationships with Planned Parenthood has dropped to 69**, *or one in 11 schools*, thanks to interventions and awareness facilitated by the Christian Schools Project.

## Methodology

Research was spearheaded by Norvilia Etienne and SFLA's Leadership Initiatives Team and conducted by SFLA staff in 2021. For purposes of this research, "Christian school" is defined as *an entity of higher education that has a publicly promoted heritage or affiliation with a Christ-centered church and rooted in the historic Christian faith*. SFLA found 784 colleges and universities fitting this definition in the United States. Three existing lists of Christian colleges and universities widely available online; Niche's 2021 Best Christian Colleges in America, USCCB's list of Catholic Colleges and Universities in the United States and the list from the publication "Institutional Vision in Christian Higher Education: A Comparison of ACCU, ELCA, and CCCU Institutions", were used as a reference in compiling SFLA's master list of 784 Christian colleges and universities. Each schools' mission statement and history were referenced and recorded to confirm adherence to Christian values before inclusion in the final 784 schools.

To gauge a school's relationship with Planned Parenthood from the vantage point of a student, researchers investigated the schools by reviewing each school's website, taking screen shots of any Planned Parenthood infractions found and contacting the school when warranted. Further insight into the school's engagement with Planned Parenthood *and* nonviolent abortion alternatives (such as local pregnancy resource centers) was gleaned by interacting with the school's Students for Life group and/or contacting school administrators directly.

After carefully recording the infractions at each of the initial 103 Christian schools, each school administration where infractions were identified was contacted and made aware of the infractions, *in case they were not aware*, and asked to remove the infracting content. Schools were emailed twice and called once, with the emails being sent on September 14<sup>th</sup> and 27<sup>th</sup>, 2021, respectively. Schools were called during the week of October 4<sup>th</sup> through 8<sup>th</sup>, 2021, with a final email reminder sent to schools that had not yet responded on October 12, ahead of the October 15, 2021, response deadline.

As a result of these communications with Christian colleges and universities, dozens of schools rectified the content on their websites, removing relationships with and promotions of Planned Parenthood. Schools were made aware that their remaining affiliations with Planned Parenthood after the October 15<sup>th</sup> deadline would be highlighted in this report.



SFLA beta tested this project on a smaller scale during the 2020-2021 school year, yielding insight into the criteria that drove the comprehensive 2021 research. The types of Planned Parenthood relationships with Christian colleges and universities fell into the following categories:

- Planned Parenthood was promoted as an active internship opportunity for which students may receive credit.
- Planned Parenthood was promoted as a student resource.
- Planned Parenthood events from 2019 onward were advertised on campus or on the website.
- Planned Parenthood was promoted as volunteer opportunity.
- Planned Parenthood partnered with the university on at least 1 event from 2019 onward.
- Planned Parenthood was promoted as a future career opportunity.

Christian schools that engaged in the above forms of relationship with the abortion giant were given infractions and assigned a grade ranging from F to A+ based on the number and type of infraction. Schools with four or more infractions received an F; schools with an F were considered to be in a "committed relationship" with Planned Parenthood. Schools with three infractions were considered to be in a "strong relationship" with Planned Parenthood and received a D. Schools with two infractions were considered to be in a "light relationship" and received a C, while those with one infraction were considered to be "in a relationship" and received a B.

Schools with no Planned Parenthood ties received an A rating. Schools that had no relationship to Planned Parenthood *and* promoted free, local pregnancy resources to students received an A+ rating.

SFLA emailed a select number of A schools in an effort to encourage them to promote pregnant and parenting student resources to their students, there by Joining the A+ Christian Schools list. To be awarded the A+ Christian School award, these Christian colleges had to provide proof of fulfilling one or more of the following criteria:

- Promoting their local Pregnancy Help Organization(s) as a pregnancy resource on their website.
- Promoting job and volunteer opportunities to work at Pregnancy Help Organizations.
- Establishing scholarships for their pregnant and parenting students.
- Working with the Standing With You initiative to further support their pregnant and parenting students, promoting <u>www.standingwithyou.org/</u> as a pregnancy resource.
- Not promoting the abortion industry in any way to the students who attend their Christian college or university.

The research period concluded on November 1, 2021, and new infractions identified after that date were not included in the final report.



## **Key Findings**

# More than 100 Christian colleges and universities were found to be in relationships with Planned Parenthood

Out of 784 total Christian schools investigated, 103 schools were initially found to be in relationships with Planned Parenthood. At the time of publication, the 69 remaining schools with infractions (after many schools agreed to cut ties with the abortion giant) shared a combined total of 175 infractions. See *Appendix A* for the full list of Christian schools with infractions.





Figure 1. Religious Affiliation of all researched Christian schools.

Of those 69 infracted schools, 15 schools received an F, meaning they had four or more infractions. An additional 14 schools received a D, with three infractions. Thirteen schools received a C, with two infractions. Twenty-seven schools received a B, with one infraction.

These remaining 69 schools' relationships with the abortion industry represents an endorsement of abortion violence and an alarming departure from the Christian tradition and biblical values. Tolerance of and direct collaboration with the abortion industry is not relegated to Christian schools, but also appears in Christian churches. In fact, collaborating with Christian churches and leaders to further its agenda has been a feature of Planned Parenthood since its inception. Planned Parenthood founder Margaret Sanger recognized the influence Christian leaders exercise over targeted communities and culture. She launched an <u>aggressive campaign</u>





through which she used such leaders as mouthpieces for the eugenics movement (which ultimately morphed into an abortion industry that has claimed the lives of tens of millions of innocent Americans).

After decades of anti-life infiltration in Christian institutions, research now suggests that the <u>incidence of abortion</u> among churchgoing women is virtually indistinguishable from that of nonbelievers. All Christian colleges and universities should be working to shift this status quo, helping to establish a cultural standard of respect for human life among young people by inculcating biblical pro-life values in their teaching and activities. To this end, SFLA has reached out to the 69 Christian schools in active partnership with the abortion industry to make them aware of the harms of this partnership and urge them to cut ties with the abortion vendor.

As of publication date, the remaining 666 Christian schools researched received an A rating because there were either no infractions found on their websites or school administration cut ties with Planned Parenthood when notified by SFLA. See *Appendix A* for a full list of A schools. As a beta test for future research, we reached out to 27 of these A schools to encourage them to join the A+ Christian Schools list. We only received a positive response and proof of the addition of pregnancy resources from two Christian Schools; Ave Maria University (FL), Catholic, and Arizona Christian University (AZ), Baptist respectfully. These two institutions are great examples of what Christian Colleges and universities need to strive toward and will be awarded the Students for Life of America A+ Christian School Award.




*Figure 2*. Frequency of Christian School infraction level vs. Christian School infraction level. Shows the level commitment infracted Christian Schools have with Planned Parenthood.

# At Christian schools, Planned Parenthood appears most frequently as a "student resource" or "internship opportunity"

At Christian colleges and universities, the most frequent infraction was Planned Parenthood being listed as a student resource. Fifty-six percent of infractions involved Christian colleges and universities promoting Planned Parenthood to students by listing the abortion vendor as a student resource.

For example, Trinity Washington University — a Catholic school — lists Planned Parenthood Federation of America <u>as a "Women's Health" resource on its website</u>. Likewise, Illinois College — a Presbyterian school — lists Planned Parenthood <u>as a place where students can apply their</u> <u>Gender and Women's Studies degrees</u> obtained from Illinois College.

The second most common infraction was Christian schools listing Planned Parenthood as a school-accredited internship opportunity within the last two years. Thirty-one percent of infractions involved Christian colleges and universities offering their students academic credit for participating in internships at Planned Parenthood.



For example, Luther College — a Lutheran school — promotes Planned Parenthood <u>as an</u> <u>internship opportunity</u>.

Other infractions included partnering with Planned Parenthood on at least one event in the past year (6%, 10 infractions); listing Planned Parenthood as a future career opportunity (4%, 8 infractions); listing Planned Parenthood as a volunteer opportunity (2%, 4 infractions); and advertising Planned Parenthood events on the school website (~1%, 1 infraction).

# Lutheran, Presbyterian, and Methodist schools make up an outsized share of infracted schools

SFLA's research investigated schools across the spectrum of Christian belief, from Catholic schools to schools affiliated with many Protestant denominations, including United Methodist Church, Presbyterian, Episcopal, Baptist, and more.

*Figure 4*. Religious affiliation vs. infraction level of infracted Christian schools. Shows the number of infracted schools per religious affiliation and the strength of their relationship to Planned Parenthood.

Certain denominations were overrepresented among infracted schools compared to the number of schools affiliated with that denomination nationwide as shown in *Figure 4*. Notably, in the Lutheran tradition 14 schools – or about one in two (52%) – was found to have a relationship with Planned Parenthood. Additionally, not a single Lutheran school has cut ties with Planned Parenthood after being notified of the existing relationship as of the date of publication.






Figure 5. Religious Affiliation of Christian Schools with Infractions.

With 15 infracted schools, more than one in four (27%) Presbyterian schools were found to be in relationship with Planned Parenthood. This is down from 17 previously infracted Presbyterian schools, as two cut ties with Planned Parenthood during SFLA's project.


In the Methodist tradition, 21 schools — nearly one in four Methodist schools (22.6%) — received infractions. Methodist schools boasted the highest concentration of infractions, with four schools receiving F ratings, four schools receiving D ratings, six schools receiving C ratings and seven schools receiving B ratings. The number of Christian Schools of the Methodist tradition with infractions is down from a starting number of 27 infracted schools, as six cut ties with Planned Parenthood during the course of SFLA's project.

# Victories: Over the course of SFLA's Christian Schools Project, one in three infracted schools cut ties with Planned Parenthood

The goal of SFLA's project is not just to expose the abortion industry relationships within Christian schools, but more importantly to work to persuade infracted schools to cut ties with




Planned Parenthood and, ideally, to build up the culture of life by promoting nonviolent pregnancy resources on campus.



*Figure 6.* Shows the percentage of Christian school administrations that have cut ties with Planned Parenthood after being notified of the existing relationship by SFLA.

At the start of SFLA's project, 103 — or one in eight — Christian colleges and universities had a relationship with Planned Parenthood. Over the course of the project, the number of infracted schools dropped to 69, as one-third of the infracted schools cut ties with the abortion vendor as shown in *figure 6*. As of publication, 34 previously infracted schools and counting have earned an A or A+ rating, see *Appendix A* for a full list of Christian school victories. These are the combined victories achieved during SFLA's Christian Schools Project beta test period in Spring, 2021, and final project completion in November 2021.






*Figure 7.* Shows the religious affiliation of Christian schools that have cut ties with Planned Parenthood after being notified of the relationship by SFLA.

Catholic colleges and universities are the most likely to cut ties with Planned Parenthood once the problem is flagged. Initially, 22 Catholic schools were in a relationship with Planned Parenthood. The number of infracted Catholic schools dropped to eight — about 3% of the nation's 237 Catholic colleges and universities — over the course of SFLA's project, with 14 Catholic schools cutting ties with Planned Parenthood. SFLA researchers stated that making the case for cutting ties with Planned Parenthood to administrators of Catholic colleges and universities was relatively easy because Catholic doctrine plainly communicates that abortion violence is an affront to human dignity. Having the ability to cite a clearly documented teaching on the matter made it clear that partnering with the Planned Parenthood abortion vendor in any way is in clear conflict with Catholic teaching.

## Exemplary, A+ Schools: The Christian colleges and universities that put their Christian, pro-life principles into tangible action

While SFLA continues to urge schools in relationships with Planned Parenthood to cut ties, it's also important to highlight the schools setting an example of pro-life action. Forty-nine schools earned an A+ rating from SFLA for maintaining no relationship with Planned Parenthood *and* promoting free, local, and nonviolent abortion alternative resources on campus. To highlight one example, Ave Maria University (AMU), Catholic, developed a "<u>Campus Care</u>" initiative, which they call a "student-led, staff supported initiative dedicated to providing support and resources to pregnant and parenting students." AMU says its vision is to empower and support "every mother and father to choose life for their child and continue their education, celebrating every life no matter the circumstances." Campus Care services include "pregnancy tests, ultrasounds, STI testing, mentoring, material assistance, housing accommodations, post-abortion healing, academic support, spiritual direction, peer support, baby showers, and free childcare to our undergraduate parents." The school even facilitates a Babysitting Program staffed by student volunteers dedicated to ensuring that parenting students can attend classes and participate in campus life even after the birth of a child.

AMU's Campus Care program utilizes, in part, resources from SFLA's <u>Standing With You</u> <u>Initiative</u> (in fact, the late <u>Jon Scharfenberger</u>, the founder of SFLA's Pregnant on Campus Initiative / Standing With You was an Ave Maria University alumnus).

Programs like AMU's "<u>Campus Care</u>" give living witness to the pro-life values professed by the Christian faith. It is SFLA's hope that schools not only distance themselves from and denounce Planned Parenthood, but also offer students an alternative to the deceit and violence of the abortion industry by standing actively in the gap with nonviolence abortion alternatives and a support network that lets students know *it's OK to be pregnant on campus*, and that the school embraces their life and the life of their child.



## Conclusion

Every university, no matter its religious or secular identity, should protect its students from the predatory abortion industry and from propaganda portraying abortion as empowering or safe. But if Christian and Catholic colleges and universities do not lead the charge in rising to this challenge, secular leftist universities can hardly be expected to trailblaze the path forward. Christian schools must set the paradigm of respect for human dignity as it is in the scripture and tradition of the Judeo-Christian worldview that belief in human dignity finds its roots.
