Christian Schools with Relationships with Planned Parenthood December 8th, 2021

Students for Life of America (SFLA), spearheaded by Norvilia Etienne and the Leadership Initiatives Team, investigated all 784 colleges and universities affiliated with Christian churches in the United States, including both Catholic and Protestant schools, and found that 103, or one in eight Christian schools, maintained some type of relationship with Planned Parenthood.

The goal of this project is to raise public awareness of Christian schools maintaining relationships with Planned Parenthood in order to encourage infracting schools to restore their Christian values by cutting ties with the abortion giant. Thanks to the intervention and awareness of SFLA's Christian Schools Project, the number of Christian schools maintaining a relationship with Planned Parenthood has dropped from 103 schools to 69 schools, or 1 in 11, as of November 1st, 2021.

The types of Planned Parenthood relationships with Christian colleges and universities fell into the following categories:

Planned Parenthood was promoted as an active internship opportunity for which students may receive credit; Planned Parenthood was promoted as a student resource; Planned Parenthood events from 2019 onward were advertised on campus or on the website; Planned Parenthood was promoted as volunteer opportunity; Planned Parenthood partnered with the university on at least one event from 2019 onward; Planned Parenthood was promoted as a future career opportunity.

Christian schools that engaged in the above forms of relationship with the abortion giant were given infractions and assigned a grade ranging from F to A+ based on the number and type of infractions.

Schools with four or more infractions received an F; schools with an F were considered to be in a “committed relationship” with Planned Parenthood. Schools with three infractions were considered to be in a “strong relationship” with Planned Parenthood and received a D. Schools with two infractions were considered to be in a “light relationship” and received a C, while those with one infraction were considered to be “in a relationship” and received a B. Schools with a + sign next to their grade were also in promotion of nonviolent abortion alternatives (such as local pregnancy resource centers).

This document details the infractions of the remaining 69 Christian Schools maintaining a relationship with Planned Parenthood as of November 1st, 2021, even after SFLA notified school administration multiple times of the relationship on their website. 



Augsburg Student Health Service Agreement With People's Center Clinics and Services

June 1, 2020 through May 31, 2021

People's Center Clinics and Services (PCCS) agrees to provide student health services to enrolled Augsburg University Students in accordance with guidelines listed below. This applies to Day, AU/WEC, and all graduate programs.

For students without insurance: \$5 co-pay

- Students are responsible for \$5.00 co-pay at the time of their visit under the Augsburg Student Health Service Agreement.
- PCCS will provide the following services that **ARE COVERED** by the Augsburg contract:
 - Office visits for acute or chronic medical problems
 - Annual physical exams 1 per year
 - Lab tests drawn and completed at PCCS
 - X-rays performed at PCCS (exclusive of the charge for the radiologist's interpretation)
 - Tetanus immunization
 - Tuberculosis skin test (Mantoux)
 - Casts, crutches, splints, slings and ace bandages
 - Allergy injections (prescription and supply must be provided by student)
 - Flu Shots
- Charges for all laboratory tests sent out to Quest lab are **NOT COVERED** under this agreement. (Of note, Quest has agreed to cover cost for most labs for most uninsured patients however individual patients MAY be billed)
- The following services may be provided by PCCS but are **NOT COVERED** by the Augsburg contract. When provided, these services would be subject to the usual PCCS sliding-scale policy for uninsured patients **WITH** an additional nominal fee. The nominal fee may be waived due to hardship per the PCCS sliding scale policy.
 - All immunizations, except tetanus and influenza
 - Psychological services. These services are covered by the Augsburg Center for Wellness & Counseling
 - Sports physicals
 - All immunizations, except tetanus and influenza
 - Birth control, i.e. IUDs, Depo, etc. (Note from CWC: For birth control, students will need to access community centers such as: **Planned Parenthood** See [Sexual Health](#) page)
- The following services are not provided by PCCS but may be ordered in the course and scope of usual care and are **NOT COVERED** by the Augsburg contract and would be the student's responsibility:
 - All laboratory charges that are required to be sent to an outside lab other than Quest
 - X-rays not performed at PCCS
 - Radiologist services, i.e. the professional charges for x-ray interpretation whether performed onsite or elsewhere.

Medical follow-up:

- Within 72 hours an individual can be treated prophylactically for certain STDs and pregnancy (if that is a concern). Most hospital ERs offer this treatment; in Cedar Rapids Unity Point Health St. Luke's Hospital and Mercy Medical Center offer emergency pregnancy prophylaxis. Most physician offices, **Planned Parenthood**, and The Emma Goldman Clinic can also provide this treatment. There may be a charge for this service. Also important is follow-up testing for STDs such as HIV.

Mental health follow-up:

- On-campus free, individual counseling is available to individuals accused of sexual assault, to help deal with feelings related to being accused, decision making, and exploring behaviors such as alcohol

Sexual Assault Prevention & Postvention

Within 72 hours the survivor can be treated prophylactically for certain STDs and within 120 hours for pregnancy (if that is a concern). There might or might not be a charge for this service. Most physician offices can provide this treatment. **Planned Parenthood** and The Emma Goldman Clinic can also provide this treatment. Both Unity Point St. Luke's Hospital and Mercy Medical Center in Cedar Rapids will provide emergency contraception. **IMPORTANT TO NOTE:** *Some religiously affiliated medical care facilities will not provide pregnancy prophylaxis, even though those hospitals will provide prophylaxis for STDs.*

After 72 hours, still encourage the survivor to seek medical attention. It is important to make sure no internal damage was done. Also important is follow up testing for STDs such as HIV.

Testing for Sexually Transmitted Infections

Drew University Health Services provides STI testing and treatment for Drew students.

Testing for a [Sexually Transmitted Infection \(STI\)](#) at Drew University Health Services is not anonymous. Students who want to be tested at Health Services should understand that testing and results are private and confidential. If you have your insurance coverage through the Drew sponsored plan, Health Services will submit your confidential claim on your behalf. All charges may not be shared with anyone besides the student and the insurer. However, if your testing fees are charged to insurance that is held by another person (guarantor) such as a parent, guardian, or spouse, testing may not be confidential. Insurance companies typically notify the guarantor of any charges applied to the policy. If a student has private insurance and prefers not to have the guarantor notified of STI testing, the student may pay Health Services directly to cover the expense of the test. DUHS can also provide treatment in the event that a result is positive for a STI. Once again, if the student pays for this directly, the information will not be shared with the insurer.

There are also HIV and STD testing sites off campus where students are able to have testing. These sites may or may not have fees. In Morristown [Planned Parenthood](#) has testing facilities and providers who can provide appropriate treatments if needed. Free HIV testing, as well as PrEP counseling, is available at the [Family Health Center of Morristown Medical Center](#). [Free STI testing sites in NJ](#) also are available for some services.

Meeting Patients Where They Are

According to the Guttmacher Institute, more than 19 million women in the U.S. do not have reasonable access to contraceptive care in their counties. The Family Planning team at Emory is working to deliver better access to care by partnering with organizations across the area and offering services at multiple locations.

Currently, the team rotates across four locations, including Grady Memorial Hospital, Emory University Hospital Midtown, Feminist Women's Health Center, Atlanta Women's Center and Planned Parenthood of Atlanta. There are teen clinics at Grady Memorial Hospital, Emory University Clifton Campus, carafem Health Center, and most recently, at Emory Saint Joseph's Hospital.

"One of the biggest barriers for teens to overcome is getting to appointments between 8 and 4 during the school day," Dr. Hailstorks says. "The Teen Clinic at Grady helps knock down some of those obstacles with hours after school and on the weekend. That makes it easier for teens to get birth control, take a pregnancy test, have their annual exam or address any other gynecologic issue they're experiencing."

It's not just teens that are benefitting from reproductive health outreach. Partnering with organizations like Planned Parenthood, Atlanta Women's Center and The Feminist Women's Center ensures high-quality care is available to women of all ages.

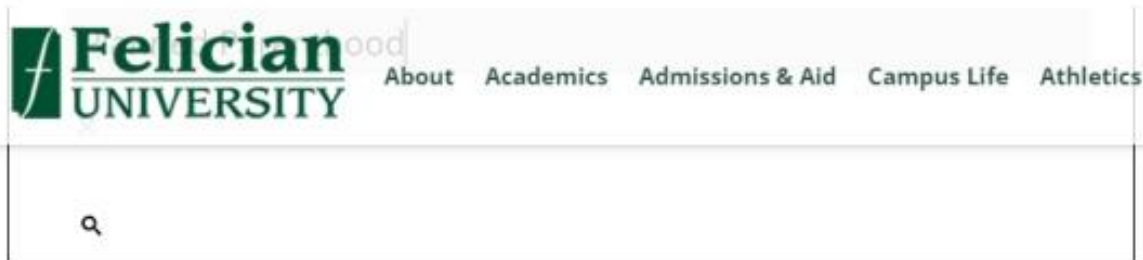

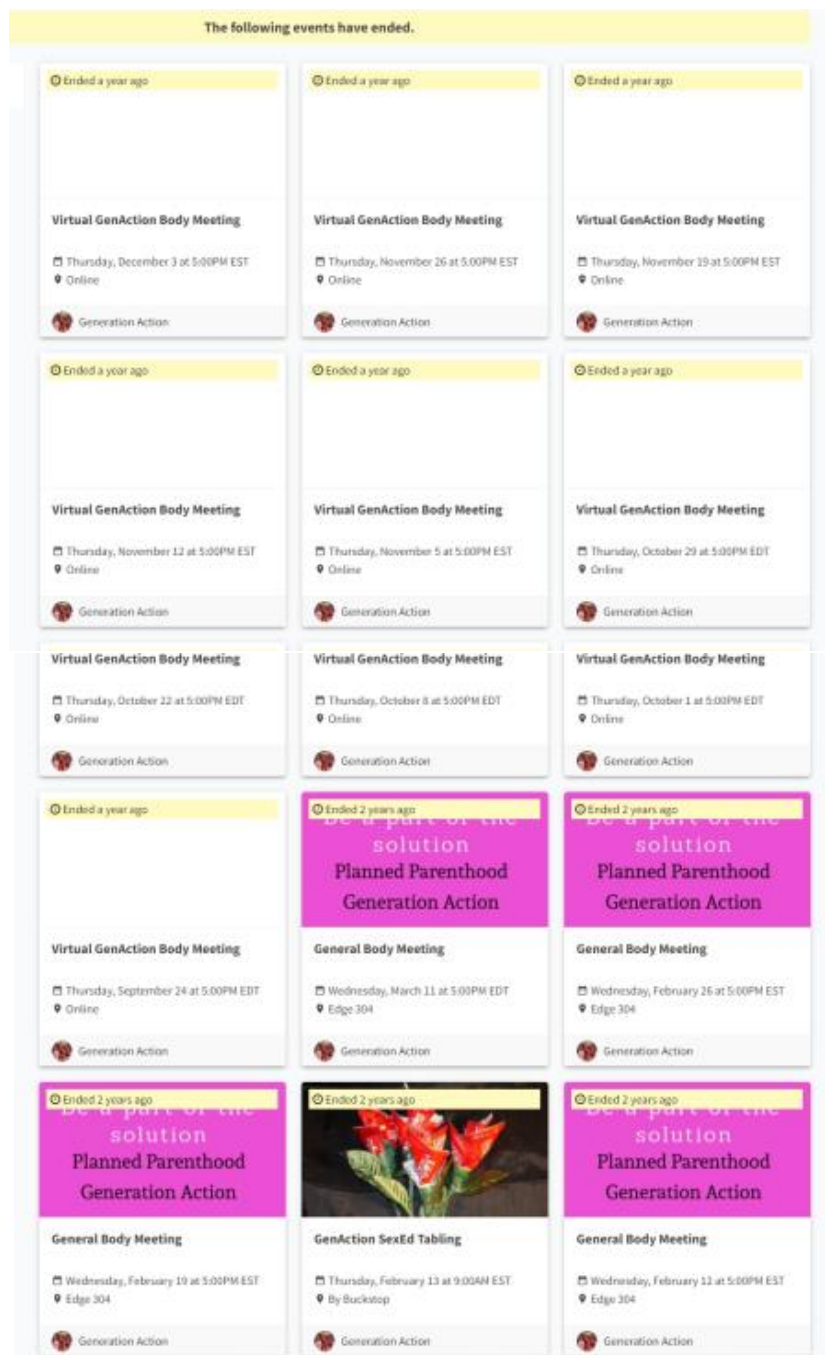



Internships taken through the Women's, Gender and Sexuality Studies program provide students with opportunities, of a kind not usually available in conventional courses, to learn with and from those outside the academic community and to apply to real-life situations the knowledge about gender and social justice that they've gained in WGSS courses. The course also can give students the chance to test the depth of their interest and the extent of their abilities in occupational fields they are considering. 

This endowment supports students in explorations of health, public health and health care professions. There are two types of Taylor Fellowships: the Taylor Shadowing Fellowship enables students to explore the work of health care professionals in clinical settings. The Taylor Public Health Fellowship provides stipends for students to work within the field of public health.





"This summer, through Muhlenberg's community internship program, I am interning with **Planned Parenthood** Keystone, a non-profit organization based around providing access to healthcare and health education for everyone. I actually have two positions, one as the Health Center Advocacy Program intern as well as the development intern.

"The majority of my time is spent as the Health Center Advocacy Program intern, where I speak to patients at the Allentown health center. My goal is to educate patients about current social issues as well as gain supporters in the process. Based on collected data, we have found that **Planned Parenthood** is largely supported by donors and not patients, so our supporter base could grow exponentially by gaining these patient supporters.

"In light of defunding and threats to **Planned Parenthood**'s services, it is super important that we have a strong supporter base so that we can stand together and fight these attacks against accessible healthcare.

"As the development intern, I have been working on a new social media campaign called 'Did you know?', which explores sexual health and education. After speaking to patients and even my own peers, I have found that there are so many misconceptions when it comes to health, especially regarding these controversial topics.

"As a biology and Spanish double major with plans to pursue a career in healthcare, this opportunity has combined my interests by allowing me to work in a clinical setting and speak directly with patients (many of whom are native Spanish speakers) as well as research topics regarding sexual health and creatively inform the public via multiple social media platforms.

"My time at **Planned Parenthood** Keystone has really opened my eyes to the reality of healthcare. I have heard stories from people that come from all walks of life and simply want and need affordable, accessible healthcare. In the future, I hope to continue to fight for healthcare rights!"

Medical Services provided by the PLU Health Center include gender-affirming care for acute illness, minor injuries, contraception management of side effects from hormone therapy, sports physicals and travel medicine consultation. Many routine immunizations are available for a fee. Influenza vaccine is available at no charge. STI screening, condoms and dental dams are offered at no charge to students. The PLU Health Center has an on-site lab for lab orders placed by any provider, regardless of whether they are a PLU or off-site clinician.

A directed internship in which students integrate their academic study of gender issues with practical experience in off-campus organizations, agencies, or businesses (10 hours per week). *The student and faculty mentor devise a reading list to complement the internship and submit it, along with an internship proposal, to the chair of the Gender and Sexuality Studies Program for approval.* Assignments may include short papers, a reading journal, and a presentation at the Gender Studies symposium or URCAS.

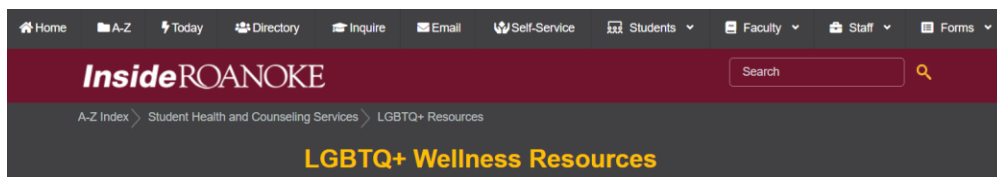

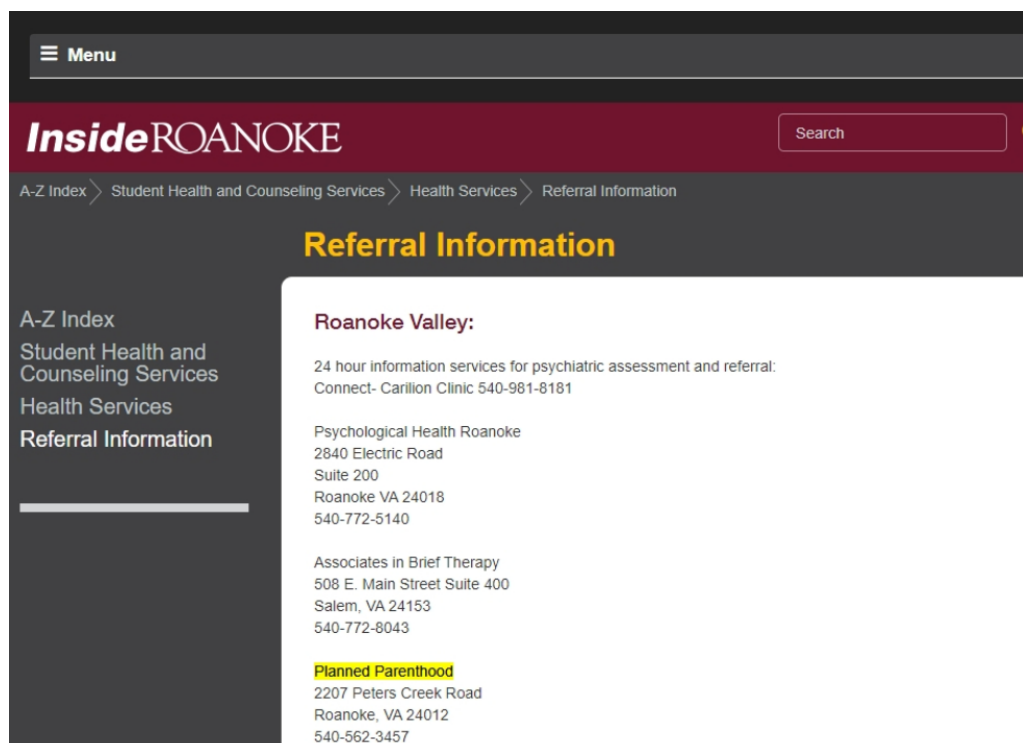

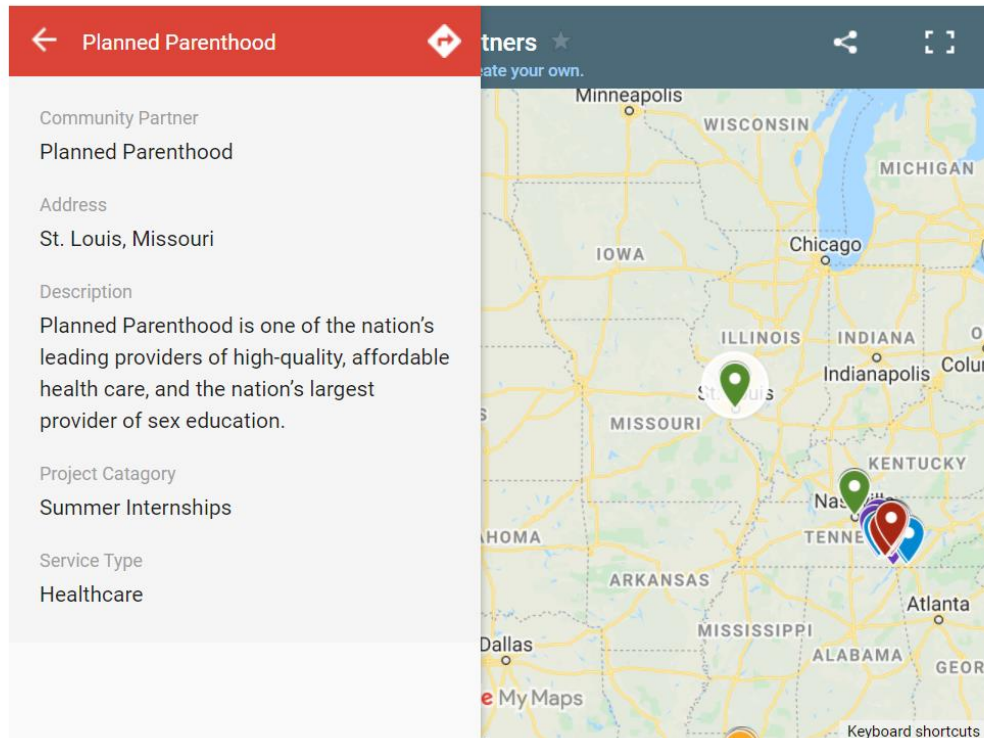

PARENTS AND TEENS TALK ABOUT SEXUALITY: A NATIONAL SURVEY

Overview

For Let's Talk Month 2014, Planned Parenthood and New York University's Center for Latino Adolescent and Family Health surveyed a nationally representative sample of 1,663 pairs of parents and their children, aged 9-21. The survey, conducted in July 2014 by GfK Custom Research, LLC, investigated how parents and children in the same households communicate about sex and sexuality, health, and relationships.

Key Findings

Most parents are talking about topics of sexuality and relationships with their children, and they are starting early.

- 8 out of 10 young people and their parents reported they had talked about sexuality.
- Of those parents who had talked to their child about sexuality, nearly half reported beginning by age 10, and 80% had started talking by age 13.
- Parents reported that they began talking early with their 9-14-year-old children about similarities and differences between boys and girls, how to deal with peer pressure, puberty, and how to stay safe online. As a result, over 80% of parents overall reported talking to their children about these topics.
- Parents of teens and young adults ages 15-21 reported they've talked about birth control methods, STD prevention, healthy relationships, and not pressuring anyone for sex.
- African-American, Hispanic, and white parents were all equally likely to report they'd talked to their children about sexuality.
- Parents reported having conversations more frequently on most sexual health topics than their children.

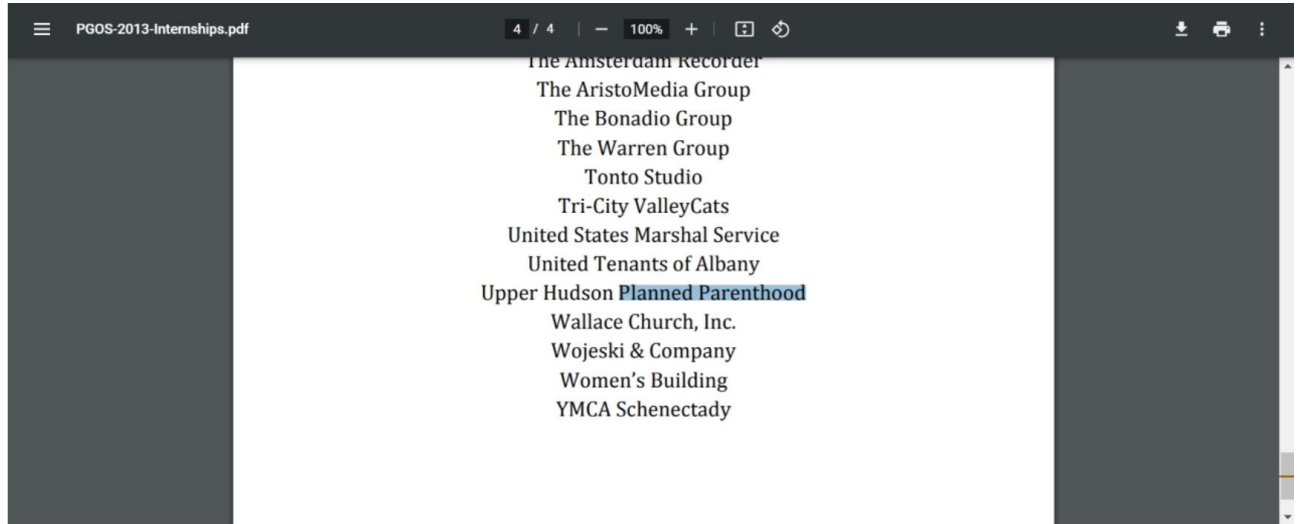

While the LGBTQ community is experiencing more social acceptance, individuals within this community still deal with stigma and discrimination. This situation often results in negative experiences with healthcare providers. Many individuals choose not share their sexual orientation with their providers, even though it is an important piece for their health care. Some people in the LGBTQ community have been subjected to therapies that have added to their hesitation and distrust in healthcare.

The stress felt by members of this community has been linked to several health disparities. The LGBTQ community tends to experience higher rates of HIV and other STIs. There are higher rates of substance abuse, smoking, depression, violence victimization and unhealthy weight control and many are less likely to participate in preventative care, such as mammograms and pap smear screenings.

There is a push for healthcare settings to become more educated on LGBTQ issues, and how to address them. If you are a member of this community, there are places at The University of Tulsa and in Tulsa that will advocate for you and help you get the care you need. A few are listed below.


